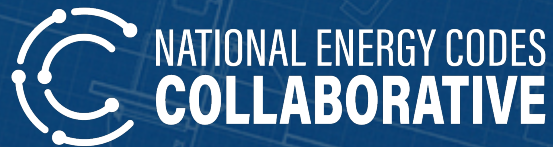


About the National Energy Codes Collaborative:

Workforce Development + Code Official Engagement TAGs

Phase / Role	Key Challenges
Design (architects & engineers)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Licensing / training often lack energy code curriculum• Non-compliant designs slow compliance process downstream
Compliance & Enforcement	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Plan reviewers and inspectors lack practical training and are over-extended• Energy code enforcement is under-prioritized• Limited career pathways; existing workforce aging out and not being replenished
Construction (Contractors & Trades)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Gaps in inter-trade training• Limited energy code knowledge• Inconsistent qualifications• Lack of time/resources to attend trainings

Workforce Development + Code Official Engagement TAGs

Phase / Role	Key Challenges
Training Existing Workforce	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Existing workforce is aging out and lacks diversity• Lack of multilingual and accessible training materials• Lack of comfort with new technology
Early Career Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Code career opportunities and programs targeting younger workforce are under-promoted• Barrier to entry (see above)
Regulators / Community Engagement	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Energy efficiency not prioritized or not seen as a financial benefit or life safety issue• Lack of agreed upon metrics to measure and evaluate compliance rates and benefits of compliance
